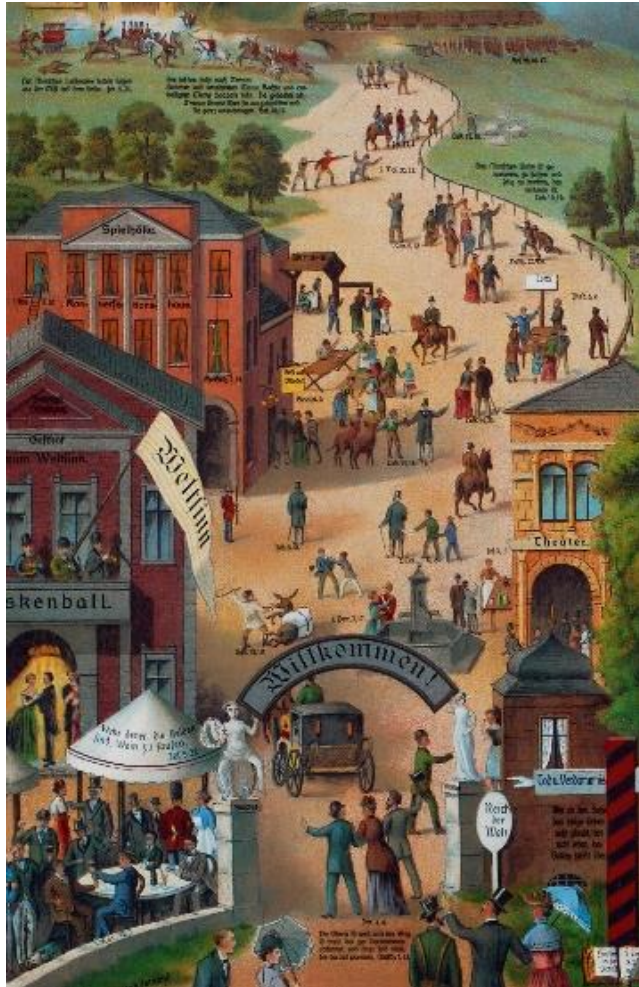


The Broad And Narrow Way

The Broad Way

Let's look at the broad way.



1. Do you remember where the broad way leads?

2. The gate says: "Welcome!" Who invites you to walk on the broad way?

3. Close to the wall are some people sitting around a table. The Bible text on the tent is Isaiah 5:22: *Woe unto them that are mighty to drink wine, and men of strength to mingle strong drink.* What are the people around the table doing?

4. What is the danger of what they are doing?

5. What are the people doing in the building on the other side of the street? What kind of music might they be listening to?

6. Just above the "Welcome" sign is a man with a donkey. Proverbs 12:10 is written beside it: *A righteous man regardeth the life of his beast: but the tender mercies of the wicked are cruel.* How is this man treating his animal? Is that how God wants us to treat animals?





7. Exodus 20:15: *Thou shalt not steal.* What are these two boys doing on the broad way?



8. Who is the man in the black coat, and what would he be saying?

9. The man in the black coat talks to a farmer with some cows. A man and a woman just walk away from him. The Bible verses are Luke 14:19 and 20: *And another said, I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to prove them: I pray thee have me excused. And another said, I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.* Do the people listen to the man in the black coat? What is their excuse?



10. Against which commandment are these two men sinning?



11. If you look really closely, you can see another man in a black coat close to the fence along the broad way. The Bible verses by this man are Luke 19:10: *For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost,* and Matthew 22:9: *Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as ye shall find, bid to the marriage.* What is the message of this preacher in the black coat?



12. Towards the end of the broad way you can see two prisoners. The Bible verse is Jeremiah 17:4, where God says: *for ye have kindled a fire in mine anger, which shall burn for ever.* What is God's response to sin?

13. This is a question to think about for yourself. You have also heard many men in black coats (ministers) preach to you. What did you do with their messages?
